



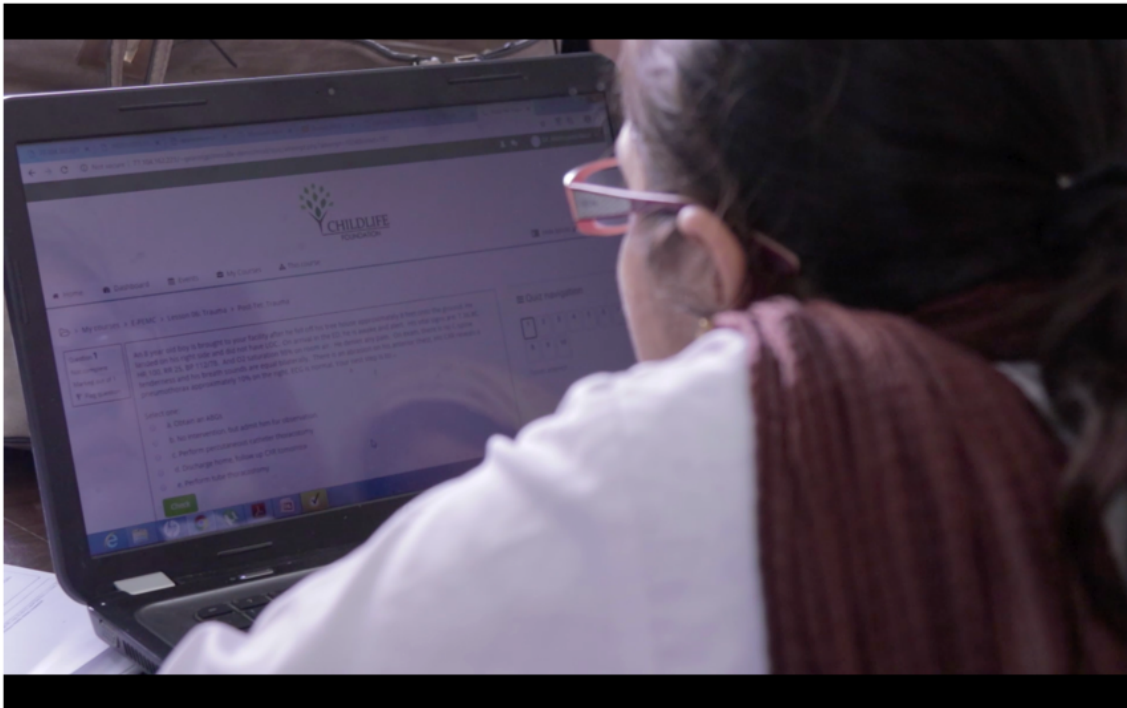
7 YEARS CELEBRATION OF CHIDLIFE'S ER – CIVIL HOSPITAL

7 year old Imran, a resident of Keamari- a dusty old area of Karachi, is suffering from asthma for 5 years. His father is asthmatic too and sells rice on a stall to support his family of 8 members.

He arrived at ChildLife Emergency Room at Civil hospital Karachi in life threatening condition and required emergent treatment by a physician. He was managed initially in resuscitation area of ChildLife Emergency Room where his condition improved after continuous nebulization and IV medications. He was later shifted to ward for

observation and nebulization. Imran's mother was grateful to ChildLife Foundation and appreciated the staff for the care being given to her son.
