



ChildLife's 15th ER: Serving Over 1 Million People in Loralai Division

We are humbled to share that ChildLife's 15th Emergency Room (ER) has opened its doors for the children of Loralai, Balochistan. Established at the Teaching Hospital in Loralai, this facility is the hospital's first dedicated pediatric emergency room, expanding access to specialized emergency care for children across the Loralai Division, serving a population of more than 1 million.

The **15-bed ER** is equipped with WHO-recommended triage system, life-saving equipment, a 24/7 pharmacy providing free medicines, and a team of 50+ trained staff dedicated to delivering quality emergency care to children, free of charge and round the clock. The facility also offers comprehensive diagnostic and radiology services and is expected to **treat 20,000 children** annually.

This milestone marks another important step toward ChildLife's vision of ensuring that every child has access to free, quality emergency care, regardless of where they are born.

A Fragile Beginning for Amin

One evening in Quetta, Yasir and Laiba rushed to Sandeman Provincial Hospital, clutching their 1.5-month-old son, Amin. He was lethargic, feverish, and struggling to breathe. Amin had been unwell for two days, and his parents overwhelmed with panic and fear initially believed it was just a high fever that would not subside.

At the ChildLife-managed Emergency Room (ER), Amin was promptly examined and diagnosed with pneumonia. The medical team immediately began his treatment, including intravenous (IV) antibiotics, maintenance fluids to treat dehydration, and oxygen therapy to support his breathing. Throughout his care, the ER team also counselled his parents, explaining his condition and reassured them every step of the way.

Within hours, Amin began responding to treatment. Over the next 48 hours, his breathing improved, fever subsided, and his strength gradually returned. By the time he was discharged, the atmosphere had completely changed. Fear and helplessness had given way to relief, hope, and gratitude.

“We have been to other clinics before,” said Yasir, “but none had such caring and dedicated staff as of ChildLife.”

Stories like Amin’s are what fuel ChildLife’s determination to ensure that no child in Pakistan is deprived of their basic right to quality emergency care.
